Policy: Ethical Practices for Volunteers, Staff & All Participants

Guidelines

- The purpose of Revive Recovery Resource Center is to guide and strengthen a participant's recovery.
- Revive Recovery Resource Center honors ALL PATHWAYS TO RECOVERY, offering a wide variety of recovery meetings.
- Please smoke in designated areas away from the building structures.
- Although we welcome children at Revive Recovery Resource Center, we cannot be responsible for childcare. Parents must be responsible for their safety and behavior.
- Safety is our number one priority. Staff will take action to ensure the safety of all persons.

Conduct

- We will be courteous, truthful, respectful, and friendly and treat each other with dignity at all times.
- Our actions influence how the community sees ourselves and the recovery community as a whole.
- We will not act in any way that violates the civil, legal, or ethical rights of others.
- We will strive to maintain a safe, clean, and recovery-oriented environment.
- We will not exploit personal relationships within RRC for personal gain or under any circumstances sexually exploit or harass other individuals.
- We will resist the use of profanity and the spreading of gossip or rumors.
- We will not bring drugs, paraphernalia, or weapons into the recovery center or any activity associated with the recovery center.

- We will keep RRRC clean and organized, maintaining a safe and sober environment.
